

Health snacks and Healthy Eating

We are always looking to promote healthy eating at Llanfair. We are still noticing a number of pupils bringing unhealthy snacks for consumption at break time. We would like to encourage the pupils to make informed decisions about what they consume. One idea is to set up a healthy snack shack which is run by the older pupils. Pupils will be provided with healthy snack at morning break time. In the first instance, we would like to gauge how many parents would support this initiative. Payment for the fruit/ vegetables would be required before hand and a commitment for a half termly period would be required. We are anticipating that it would cost 30p per day equating to £1.50 per week.

You are still welcome to provide a healthy snack for your child should you wish to do so.

Uniform

Please remember that as part of our uniform policy necklaces, rings and jewellery are not permitted. This is for the safety and protection of your children. Due to health and safety requirements looped earrings are not permitted in school. Please could you make sure that only stud earrings are worn please.

School Bags and belongings

Please ensure that all items of clothing, lunchboxes, water bottles and belongings are clearly labelled with your child's name. Can you please ensure that children do not bring toys to school as they get very upset when they lose them. We also ask that large bags are not brought into school unless absolutely necessary as these are causing a trip hazard in classes particularly in the Foundation Phase. A labelled small lunchbox or snack pot is sufficient.

Sponsorship opportunity

We are looking for sponsorship to be able to provide a netball and football kit to our teams. We are hoping to organise school matches with neighbouring schools in the next couple of months and would love for our children to look the part. We place a high emphasis on Attendance at Llanfair. We aim for an attendance target in excess of **95%** for every pupil. You will receive a breakdown of your child/children's attendance at the end of this half term. I appreciate that there have been bouts of illness particularly during the Autumn term, however, it is important that children attend school on a regular basis for their wellbeing and academic progress if they are fit and healthy.

The letters you will receive outline if we have any concerns about your child's attendance. We will monitor attendance levels of pupils where we have concerns and if there is no improvement we will seek support from external agencies.

Also please can I remind you that school gates open at **8.50am** and all pupils should be on the premises by **9am**.

Reading helpers

If you or someone that you know would be willing to support pupils reading in school we would love to welcome you as a reading volunteer. Even if you can spare an hour of your time we would really appreciate it. There would need to be checks carried out including a DBS certificate.
