
The 3 boxes below are the focused activities for nursery pupils this week. Please take some pictures so that you can share what you have been doing with us!


Oi Dog!

 We will be reading Oi Dog! In school this week. If you're not in school, here is a link to the story being read online.





- There are lots of books in the series Oi Frog, Oi Cat etc and they all focus on rhyming. Discuss rhyming words in the book – can you spot the rhyming words? Talk about what each animal is allowed to sit on.

Sound of the week - d

Say the rhyme as you write – Round his bottom, up his tall neck and down to his feet.



- Concentrate on your name this week. What sounds do you have in your name?
- Can you practice writing your name using our Read, Write inc letter rhymes?
 Remember to check that your letters start in the right place and try to hold your pencil correctly. We will be completing a name writing activity in school this week.
- There are lots of different practical ways that you can practice your name at home. Here are some pictures – you could make a name jigsaw out of your name too.





Mathematics

- Frogs are good at jumping. Can you jump like a frog? Can you measure how far you have jumped? You could use cones to measure the distance. Who can jump the furthest in your house?
- Draw around your foot. Can you measure how long your foot is? You could measure your foot using pennies or counters. You could measure using an egg box like in the picture below. (You don't need to use a ruler at this age, non-standard measures are used to introduce the concept of measure) You could draw around the feet of the people who live in your house. Are their feet bigger or smaller than yours?
- If you really enjoy measuring, you could look for some other things to measure around your house.

Creative

 Draw some pictures of your favourite animals from the Oi Dog! or Oi Frog! book. Can you draw what they are sitting on too? You could upload a photo of your drawings or even a little video to explain what you have drawn.





Knowledge and Understanding of the World

- Sorting animals have a look at the sorting animals branching database in your shared folder. Look at the animals in the left-hand box. Choose an animal. Click play. Answer the questions about the animal you have chosen (click on the blue speech bubble to hear the question being read) and the computer should guess which animal you were thinking of!
- If you would really like a challenge, you can try to create your own animal branching database in J2e. (See instructional video saved separately).
- If you have toy animals at home you could try to sort them. Can you sort the animals according to where they live? Do they live on land, in the sea or in the sky?
