
The 3 boxes below are the focused activities for nursery pupils this week. Please take some pictures so that you can share what you have been doing with us!

 Read/listen to the book. There's a YouTube link below if you don't have a copy of the book at home.



Sound of the week - 's'




Slither down the snake.

- Practise forming the letter 's' and saying our rhyme 'slither down the snake'
- Can you make a 's' shape using natural material, like leaves?



Number of the week - 7

- Find a dandelion clock on a spring walk (see below) – count how many puffs you have to do to blow all the seeds off. Can you do it in 7 puffs?

Knowledge & Understanding

 Go for a spring walk (as part of your daily exercise) – look and listen for sights and sounds of spring. You can bring along a Spring hunt sheet and tick off what you spot, there are two to choose from (saved separately)



Creative

Collect some things along the way on your spring walk. When you get home, stick them onto some cardboard to make a spring crown. It can be as simple or fancy as you like!



Numeracy – patterns

 Use some natural materials such as sticks, pine cones, leaves or stones that you collected on your spring walk to make a repeating pattern. Ask a grown up to start a pattern and see if you can finish it! Can you follow a repeating pattern of 2 items? Stick, leaf, stick, leaf... Yes? Fantastic! Now try 3 items, or maybe try stick, stick, cone, stick, stick, cone...
