

### Online Safety for Parents

gives you the tools and confidence to support your child's digital wellbeing - at every age and stage.

Parents who attend the workshops will receive an information handbook and the opportunity to meet other parents and share experiences.

Online Safety for Parents is an informative and supportive session designed to help parents and carers understand the risks young people face online, and how to guide them in using technology safely and responsibly. Today's young people are born into a world where advanced technology exists and for this 'Cyber Savvy' generation, the right and ability to use technology manifests itself in a myriad of ways with young people learning, communicating, socialising and gaming through, with and because of technology.

Technology is easily abused and misused and if we are allowing our children use of and access to these tools, we must ensure they are able to use them safely and respectfully

This 2-hour workshop provides practical advice, up-to-date information, and simple strategies for protecting children in an ever-changing digital world.

#### **This workshop helps parents to:**

- Understand popular apps, games, and social media platforms
- Recognise online risks such as online bullying, grooming, and inappropriate content
- Learn how to set boundaries and use parental controls effectively
- Start open, honest conversations about online behaviour and safety

As you know, online safety is an extremely important topic and together we can help support our children in navigating the digital world safely.

The workshop will cover key aspects of keeping children safe online and provide practical advice for parents. It will last approximately 1 hour and will begin at 3:40 pm, once all children have been dismissed.

The school will be celebrating Red Nose Day on **Friday 20th March**. The school council are busy organising the day and will soon communicate further information.


The school has set up a link to donate to the charity on ParentPay. The donation will go straight to the charity.
